# **FEEDING INSTRUCTIONS:**

Feedlot Receiving:

Incoming cattle should be offered good quality hay free choice until they have eaten to capacity. On the second day after cattle have arrived at the feedlot introduce Show-Rite Rite Fiber at 1% of body weight along with free choice hay. By day 3 after arrival offer Show-Rite Rite Fiber at approximately 2% of body weight along with grain and roughage or offer Show-Rite Rite Fiber as the sole ration. Frequent feeding is recommended to promote maximum intake in stressed animals. Provide clean fresh water at all times.

### Weaning:

Offer Show-Rite Rite Fiber free choice along with roughage to nursing calves for up to 30 days before weaning. Provide clean fresh water at all times.
